CLUB DISCIPLINE.

The Classic Sports Car Club promotes and expects excellent driving standards and behaviour from its members. This includes the members actions both on and off the circuit, and can include bringing the club or its series into disrepute, driving standards and use of social media and video. If the CSCC committee believes that a member has fallen below the standards expected of him the club may impose penalties or actions (see below) in addition to those that may be imposed by the MSA. All Classic Sports Car Club races are strictly non-contact, however, should an on-track incident occur members must follow the MSA rules and take any grievance to the officials at the circuit. It should be noted that a sincere apology between members can go a long way to diffusing a situation.

The agreed club practice when dealing with club members racing behavior is as follows -

1. The Clerk of the Course gives a verbal warning to the driver at the race meeting and enters his/her name in a book.

At the end of each meeting the series driver representative can view details of formal action on the TSL results and will contact the office to establish the facts of an incident. The competitor can be spoken to by a member of the committee.

2. If the competitor commits another misdemeanor and his/her name is entered into the book, the club Competition Director will send the competitor a letter of warning. The club reserves the right to fit a camera to any competitors car at a race meeting to observe driving standards.

3. If the competitor commits a third misdemeanor, or if a competitor is deemed responsible for causing an incident resulting in a race stoppage, the CSCC may suspend the driver for one race and refuse an entry to the clubs European events in the following 12 months.

4. If the competitor commits a fourth misdemeanor the club will send a final letter, on behalf of the committee, asking the member to resign from the club for a specified period.

Notwithstanding the above, the Committee reserve the right to accelerate the process to point 2, 3 or 4, depending on the severity of the incident.

The Club reserves the right to apply a time limit to any of these 4 stages or to change or update these guidelines at any time.
