# Silverstone Season Starter Race Meeting Supplementary Regulations (Issued 17/01/25)





- The Classic Sports Car Club will organise and promote a Race Meeting at Silverstone International Circuit on Saturday 8th/Sunday 9th March 2025.
- 2. The meeting will be held under the National Competition Rules of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions the organising Club may issue for the event.
- 3. Motorsport UK permit number: 201342 (Interclub). This event is NCAFP inscribed. The following Championship races will also take place:

Lackford Engineering Midget & Sprite Challenge: Permit TBC

Ramair BMW Championship: Permit TBC

- 4. The meeting is open to all fully elected members of the organising Club.
- 5. Competitors must hold a Motorsport UK race licence of Race Club or higher grade. (Please note NCR Ch. 12 App. 4 Art. 6.2) **If you have not already done so when registering, please email a copy of your 2025 race licence to** <u>info@classicsportscarclub.co.uk</u>
  Please note that competitors holding a race licence not issued by Motorsport UK, can only participate with written authorisation from their ASN (article 2.3.7 FIA International Sporting Code).
- 6. The Circuit is Silverstone International circuit and is 1.85 miles in length. Racing will be in a clockwise direction. For the avoidance of doubt, the International layout uses the modern GP section through Valve and Club.
- 7. Sign on is by digital sign on. Any competitor not digitally signed-on by 17:30 on Wednesday 5th March 2025, may be excluded. Scrutineering will be done for selected categories only, as listed within the Timetable and Final Instructions. There is no pre-event self-scrutineering.

Qualifying starts at 09.00 on both days. The meeting will open at 07.30 on both days.

Race engines must not be run before 08:45 and after 18:15 on each day. Competitors not complying with this may be reported to the Clerk of the Course.

- 8. Races There will be 14 races as follows (NOT IN TIMETABLE ORDER):
  - If the same car and driver is registered for, and entered into any additional race/s at this meeting, the entry fee for the additional (cheaper) race/s is reduced by 50%. Please note that if entering more than one race online, the online booking system is unable to automatically apply the discount, so you will need to pay full price initially. The CSCC will then refund any additional race discount to you as soon as possible, but certainly within two weeks of you booking.
- 9. Class Structure and Awards are as per Championship/Series Regulations.
- 10. The entry list opens on publication of these Supplementary Regulations and closes on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> March 2025. To encourage early entry, all entries received after Sunday 23rd February 2025 will incur an additional £30 fee. This also applies to second drivers. NO ENTRIES WILL BE CONSIDERED AFTER WEDNESDAY 5<sup>th</sup> March 2025.

Registered CSCC drivers may enter and pay online using the ProSolve booking system up until Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> February, all other entries must be made on the official entry form and accompanied by the appropriate fee. To save administration time and costs, entries will be acknowledged by e-mail whenever possible. (See section 11, Reserves)

For your security, e-mailed entry forms (complete with signature) must not contain credit/debit card details, instead please call the office with these after e-mailing the form.

Entry will only be accepted on receipt of the fee and properly completed form. Cheques/cash are no longer accepted.



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Entries will be selected to conform with (NCR Ch. 6 App. 1 Art. 10) and 1) Registered Championship/Series contenders first and 2) Entry forms received in chronological order.

- 11. Lackford Engineering Midget & Sprite Challenge, Ramair BMW Championship, Adams & Page Swinging 60s, Classic K and Verum Builders Open Series Entries: Whilst we are waiting for permits to be returned from Motorsport UK, any entries for these categories will be held in abeyance (NCR Ch.6 App.1 d.). The moment that these championship and series permits are issued, completed entries will automatically be accepted in the order that entry/payment is made.
- 12. Reserves. As per (NCR Ch. 6 App. 1 Art. 10.4) Note that entering and paying online does not mean you have a confirmed place, the online system is unable to notify you if you are a reserve or on a waiting (non-qualifying reserve) list. We will notify you within 7 days of entering if you are a reserve or on a waiting list. If you are on the waiting (non-qualifying reserve) list, you are not officially entered into the meeting and are unable to take part in the event, unless others who entered ahead of you withdraw before qualifying takes place.
- 13. Refunds. Entry fees will be refunded in full under the terms of (NCR Ch. 6 App. 1 Art. 11.1) if a competitor notifies the organiser in writing by email of their withdrawal by the end of the day on Sunday 23rd February 2025. Any withdrawals received from Monday 24th Feb 2025 up until the end of the day on the closing date on Wednesday 5th March 2025, will be refunded, less a £25 administration fee. There will be NO REFUNDS OR CREDITS for any withdrawals received after the closing date of Wednesday 5th March 2025, with the exception of those who are on a reserve or waiting (non-qualifying reserve) list. If you need to withdraw your entry from a race with a reserve list, we may offer you a partial or full refund, provided you immediately notify the Secretary of the Meeting that you are withdrawing and that there is a paying entry that is able to fill your place at that time.
- 14. The maximum number of starters will be 44 cars and the minimum will be 10. Should any of the minimum figures not be reached, the organisers have the right to either cancel the meeting or the race. They may amalgamate or split qualifying, races or classes, substitute races or move competitors as appropriate.

- 16. Competition Numbers must be displayed in accordance with (NCR Ch. 7 App. 2 Art. 22.21 / NCR Ch. 7 App. 10 / NCR Ch. 7 App. 13 Diagram 1 / NCR Ch. 12 App. 4 Art. 5). It is the driver's/entrant's responsibility to ensure that numbers are properly presented for scrutineering as per (NCR Ch. 12 App. 4 Art. 5.2) and are clearly visible for qualifying and race. Note that in sessions that are combined with another category, where numbers would be duplicated, cars must display the correct numbers as allocated in the digital race programme.
- 17. Grid positions are determined by times recorded in official qualifying, except in:
  Lackford Engineering Midget & Sprite Challenge, Ramair BMW Championship and Gold Arts Magnificent Sevens, where the grids will be set as per Series/Championship regulations.
- 18. All other General Regulations of Motorsport UK apply as written.
- 19. Standing starts will be used for all races except the Liqui Moly Slicks/WOSP New Millennium who will have a rolling start. The starting signal for all races will be given by lights. In the event of any starting lights failure, the Starter will revert to the use of the National Flag.
- 20. Provisional results will be announced as soon as possible after each session on the CSCC electronic noticeboard at: <a href="https://www.classicsportscarclub.co.uk/silverstone-international">www.classicsportscarclub.co.uk/silverstone-international</a>
- 21. Protests. Entrants are reminded that protests should be made in writing in accordance with Motorsport UK (NCR Ch. 2 App. 9).
- 22. Super Unleaded Fuel supplies will be available at the circuit.
- 23. Admission: A single driver team will receive 4 personnel passes. If part of a two-driver team, the first driver will receive 4 personnel passes and the second driver will receive 2 personnel passes. No paddock vehicle passes are needed. No animals allowed.
- During qualifying, it is a competitor's responsibility to ensure that he/she completes the requisite number of laps. Some qualifying sessions may be amalgamated or split (NCR Ch. 12 App. 6 Art. 3).
- 25. Parc Ferme will take place as directed by officials.





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- 26. Judges Of Fact (NCR Ch. 12 App. 3 Art. 2) will be named in the final entry list (digital event programme) for: Eligibility (Chief Scrutineer), Noise (Environmental Scrutineer) and Timing (Chief Timekeeper). Other Judges may be appointed as required, and will be detailed in Final Instructions, Entry List (digital event programme) or Bulletins.
- 27. Transponders will be required at this meeting as per (NCR Ch. 12 App. 6 Art. 2.2). Please make sure your number is clearly written on your registration/entry form and let us know if it changes. Transponders must be located as per manufacturers' instructions.
- 28. In the case of the abandonment or cancellation of races or the meeting, the organisers will retain sufficient of the entry fees in order that costs/expenses incurred shall be covered.
